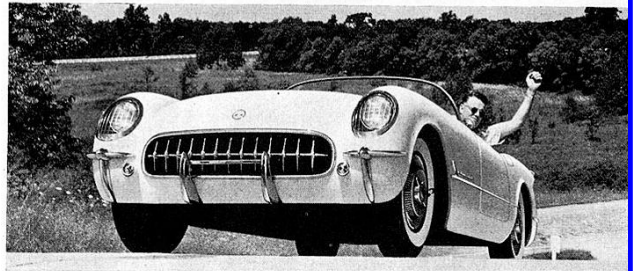

“They are shivering, pathetically shivering!!!!!!”

December 1, 2010

Arrived in Florida and stopped at the Welcome Center for a “free” 1 oz. plastic cup of reconstituted frozen orange juice and some maps and literature to ‘bone’ up on the sights to see in Florida..... and to my good friend and Combat Veteran Brother “Bones”, I use the word ‘bone’ once every now and then in my literary diatribes describing sojourns here and yonder and no relation or pun intended.... However, as a disclaimer, you will find a cacophony of words in this sojourn, at least for today.

Ya all, as they say in the south, have seen the National Wx forecast, haven’t you? This proves the Nobel Peace Prize committee is composed of idiots, doesn’t it? Global Warming my a- -, it is colder than a well diggers behind down here in “sunny Florida, no it is colder than that.... I have been practicing talking to Bonney and telling her how warm it is going to be in Florida and we will be lying out in the sun and drinking cold ones to keep cool while we napped in the sun. Wow! Did I ever exaggerate and ended up telling a whopper! (Liody, this kind of whopper is not a burger.)

We talked on the phone while driving south on I-95 to Joel (remember Joel and Sue we met up with in Indiana a while back?). Joel and Sue are now retired and have a fifth wheel and are heading to Ocala Florida after a short delay in Chattanooga to replace some wheel bearings. Ocala is more to the north and west of where we are staying and the weatherman is having a ball with the forecast for tonight as it is going to drop into the upper 20s in Ocala and have the first freeze of the season in Florida. We are due west of Orlando near the town of Clermont which is next to Kissimmee and on the back or front door of Disney world. In fact, after our arrival at Thousand Trails Orlando, in Lake County Florida, we drove a few miles to a fruit stand where the locals go to buy their fruit and it is on 2,500 acres of orange, grapefruit, tangerines and vegetables fields that border on Disney World. Chelsea, the girl working at the fruit stand gave us a primer on “Oranges 101” and had several samples to give us. We settled on the ruby red navels and yellow gold navels with a couple of easy peel tangerines thrown in and also bought some fresh baby red potatoes and a loaf of Cranberry Banana bread..... makes you drool doesn’t it? Chelsea said if we would like, we can pick our own fruit off the trees. We had some pork chops in a special bourbon sauce, with the last of the Charleston Farmers Market green beans and also some baby reds with a fruit salad. We really enjoy our meals in the RV and have no one to blame if the meal is not good. It sounds like a lot, but we need the extra calories to keep up with the damn arctic blast that is greeting us in Florida.

It won’t freeze here where we are, like it will in Ocala where Sue and Joel are, but it sure won’t feel warm either. I am running some small heaters as I write this and have the RV heated up to 75°F like it should be anyway here in “sunny Florida”. We have an RV site that is about 250 yards from the pier on Lake Hancock that is suppose to be a very good black bass lake. After we set up, I grabbed a spinning rod

and put a purple worm on and headed for the dock. I was greeted by alligator warning signs and decided it was too cold for any self respecting gator to be out looking for a fisherman and was more likely digging a nice warm mud bath to soak in while the cold spell was here. I also made the call that no water moccasin, rattle snake or coral snake would be out looking for fishermen in this cold and besides that, I didn’t look like a Floridian with my jacket on either..... in fact, I was the only fisherman on the lake due to the cold. The lake is magnificent and is spring fed with choreographed classic Lilly pads, crystal clear water and several white egrets shivering along the banks looking for some freezing fish or shivering frogs to eat. I worked the waters with every technique I knew and had a few jumpers splashing nearby and it seemed when I cast way out, they would jump close in and when I worked the edge of the Lilly pads, they would jump far out. After about an hour, it was getting dark, very dark and soon would be very, very, very dark, and all the noises sound different in the dark (much like airplane noise while flying at night sound different, don’t they John T.?) and there are no street lights out in this beautiful back country lake, so I walked in the center of the sandy road listening to sounds along the edge of the jungle as the night “things” were coming out. My teeth were almost chattering, not words, but due to the cold when I went back inside the RV, skunked too! (Liody, Skunked means no fish, not sprayed). A lot of fishermen have a saying that even a bad day of fishing is a very good day, but today, that is wrong, a bad day of fishing was because the temperature dropped more than 20°F since yesterday and the fish are in shock and the Wild Duck is cold.... When we first stopped at the “Welcome Center” for that free 1 oz. reconstituted frozen orange juice, we dashed from the RV to the center (because it was cold outside) and what did we see? These little black birds, bigger than a sparrow, but smaller than a crow, were just standing there, fluffing out there feathers and not even moving out of our way, the birds just continued standing on the sidewalk shivering, pathetically shivering and waiting for some dumb tourist to get them a sandwich or cookie to eat. It is really cold in Florida when you see the birds shiver.

I might write some more later, and then again, I might, along with the dog, go into hibernation until the arctic blast goes away. And oh yes, Mike and Carol in Wisconsin, I know it is cold there, but it is suppose to be cold there. It is not suppose to be cold in Florida. Hopefully when we are 90 miles away from Cuba, in Key West, it will not be so cold. But I am not betting on it. Enough of my global whining..... (shivering in Florida)
